

But for the library, the answer comes down to two possibilities: the joy and bustle of Summer Reading—or my own favorite day of all: the day the Friends write their annual donation check. It may not be as catchy a name as “Arbor Day,” but it is a tremendously important day for what it allows the Montgomery-Floyd Regional Library to accomplish throughout the year.

Each November, we prepare a budget that outlines for our governmental funders—Montgomery County, Floyd County, the towns, and the state—how we intend to use our funds for the upcoming fiscal year (July–June). These dollars support library materials and computer systems; staff compensation; the technology that powers our catalog and checkout systems; gas for the courier van and mobile library; and a long list of other operational needs. With this support, we pursue our mission: to welcome all people to spaces, services, and resources that empower individuals and our community to thrive. We know that providing access to materials—and the tools to find and enjoy them—is central to why patrons rely on us, whether for learning and growth or simply for a healthy, entertaining break from life's demands.

But as Friends of the Library, you know that our branches also offer programs, exhibits, artwork, and a sense of welcome and comfort beyond the basics. When we submit our budget to Montgomery and Floyd counties, very little of those “extras” appear. For programming, we turn to the Friends. And we could not ask for better supporters.

Consider what your contributions made possible:

- In Fiscal Year 2025, the Friends funded 503 library programs.
- 11,064 people attended those programs.
- The Friends also supported more than 1,000 self-directed activities, enjoyed by over 12,000 patrons—including craft kits, puzzles and coloring, and Christiansburg Library’s StoryWalk.

Your annual donation pays for everything from children’s Summer Reading performers to Music on the Lawn to Chair Yoga. You support more than a dozen book clubs, sensory programs, and music therapy programs for patrons with cognitive, developmental, and intellectual disabilities. You help bring in “crowd-pleasers” like visits from Mill Mountain Zoo. You fund our movie-licensing agreement. And whenever a program needs supplies, food, or snacks—the Friend’s funding makes it happen.

I’m old enough to remember when library programming meant children’s storytime and not much else. Today, programs are a powerful way to expand our community’s intellectual, cultural, and social lives. While they don’t replace books—after all, no one stays up until 1 a.m. to finish a library program—I’m incredibly proud of the creativity, relevance, and dedication our programming staff bring to their work. It’s no coincidence that MFRL has earned recognition from the Virginia Association of Counties for initiatives like Family Reads and the Sensory Museum program—both supported in part by the Friends.

So for me, the most wonderful time of the year is the moment we request and receive funding from the Friends. Because your generosity makes one of the very best things about the library possible—day after day, all year long.

2025 Garden Tour Sales and Attendance

Our last issue reported that the 2025 Garden Tour was a big success, and nothing says it like the numbers.

Library staff and garden greeters sold tickets for a total of \$8,260. Thank you to the library staff and all the greeters!

Our generous donors contributed \$2,650 to cover garden tour expenses of \$2,368 with \$282 to spare. Thank you to all our donors!

The Friends of the Library will pass the total revenue, \$8,541, to the library system.





Branch Updates

Christiansburg | The Christiansburg Library is excited to announce that 2026 marks the 40th anniversary of our current library location. After outgrowing the old church building on the corner of Radford Road and Depot Street, where we had been located since 1977, Montgomery-Floyd Regional Library secured funding from the Montgomery County Board of Supervisors, federal grants, and the Friends of the Library to build a new Christiansburg Library on Sheltman Street. The new Christiansburg Library (originally known as the Headquarters Library) opened its doors in 1986 and provided over 15,000 square feet of space for collections and programming for Christiansburg and the surrounding community. To celebrate 40 years in this building, we will have programs all year long, including a special 40 Things for 40 Years Beanstack challenge and an All Ages Birthday Bash on September 12th. This anniversary comes at an auspicious time as Montgomery County has earmarked over \$16 million to renovate and expand the Christiansburg Library within the next 5 years. We have once again outgrown our facilities and we are very excited for this opportunity. As with the previous capital improvement, this will require a partnership between Montgomery County funding and community support. To kick off our Christiansburg Capital Campaign, we have 40th anniversary commemorative merchandise available online. Twenty-five percent of all sales will go to the Montgomery-Floyd Regional Library Foundation to be used for renovation needs.
