#### Book-Making Program and Art at the Blacksburg Library

Recently the Blacksburg Library hosted an evening program of book-making. Using funds provided by the Friends of the Library, we secured Becca Imbur, a local artist, to lead a workshop in the art of creating a small, handmade accordion-style book. Supplies were provided for the first twenty adults who registered and registration was full with a long waiting list! All who attended made a small book to give as a Valentine's Day gift or to keep for their own enjoyment. Many inquiries have been made since if we'll be able to offer another program with Becca, and we certainly hope so.





Becca Imbur is a mixed media book artist who lives in Blacksburg. She sells book-making kits online through *Etsy* – you can find her offerings at *Bimbur Books & Design*. Becca is committed to community building and engagement and also had previously offered a free book making workshop to local teens at the Blacksburg branch. We were very thankful not only for the funding from the Friends to make the adult book-making program available but also that Becca is a bibliophile and a library supporter, which means she gave us a superb discount! Keep your eyes peeled – we hope to repeat this program in the near future!

The Blacksburg Library continues to highlight local artists in a variety of

ways including constantly having artwork on display. Our *Meet the Artists* series has brought many local artists in to talk about their work, provide a demonstration and even lead workshops on occasions. Local

wood turner Harold Lambert recently displayed his work and talked about his craft. P. Buckley Moss's work has been on display throughout February and she offered a presentation and demonstration on Sunday, March 6 at 2:00 PM.

The Textile Artists of Virginia (TAVA) group will display their "Everything Nature" creations in July through August. #### **Upcoming Events**

The first day of spring is Saturday, March 19<sup>th</sup>! In celebration, Master Gardener Erica Jones and the Christiansburg Library will host *a* **Welcome Spring event** from 2-4, offering crafts, seed planting, leaf rubbings, and other activities for all ages.

*Bill Jamerson Presents: Dollar-A-Day Boys;* a fun, nostalgic look at the 1930's Federal Works Program that gave employment to 3.5 million men. This musical tribute to the Civilian Conservation Corps will include hilarious stories, foot tapping songs, and a short video, making this a "must see" experience!
