In October, author Neil Gaiman gave a talk to the Reading Agency in London. You can read his lecture in its entirety at [www.readingagency.org.uk](http://www.readingagency.org.uk). He talks about his love of reading and libraries and how important both are to our society. He reminds us that there are no bad authors, bad genres or bad books for children. As long as kids are reading, the what doesn't matter. Comic books, graphic novels, R.L. Stine—let them read what they are interested in. He said, "The simplest way to make sure that we raise literate children is to teach them to read, and to show them that reading is a pleasurable activity. And that means, at its simplest, finding books that they enjoy giving them access to those books and letting them read them." He ends his lecture

quoting Albert Einstein who was once asked how we could make our children intelligent. Einstein said, "If you want your children to be intelligent," he said, "read them fairy tales. If you want them to be more intelligent, read them more fairy tales." So pick up a book tonight and read to your child.

### From the Blacksburg Library

The Blacksburg Library recently received a new circulation desk to replace the desk that had been in place since the 1996 building renovation. While fortunate that the old desk held up as long as it did, the library staff enjoy a more modern desk to assist in better serving the patrons - thanks to MFRL Library Director Paula Alston and the Montgomery County Board of Supervisors!

The new desk offers many improved features including a raised height which makes it more comfortable for staff; a curved shape which increases security and closes the public access to the staff work room; updated technology features for charging circulating devices; more space to store items including the Wii, PS3 and Xbox games; designated display shelving for browsing; and a forward facing design that enables staff to more readily see and greet patrons as they enter the library!

More enhancements and changes are also in the works to the public space. Two new tables and eight chairs have been put into use and more are on the way. These new tables are power-ready, a feature that has been in demand as more patrons come to the library for wireless access and to work on their devices. Also, keep an eye out for a new Express Check-out machine which will offer fast service to patrons on-the-go who may also want to take advantage of nearby self-service holds. Patrons will find the Express touch screen easier to use and will also appreciate an updated scanner.



Last but not least, look for changes to the layout of the library. The magazine shelving has been an area for improvement as it blocks the view of part of the library. In keeping with advice we've received from the Blacksburg Police Department, making changes to this area will increase visual awareness and security! We'll also have additional seating areas and new magazine display units to improve the accessibility of the magazine collection.

The Blacksburg Library thanks our patrons for their patience as we continue to make improvements to the library. Many thanks to the Board of Supervisors for the one time expenditure that has afforded us a new circulation desk!

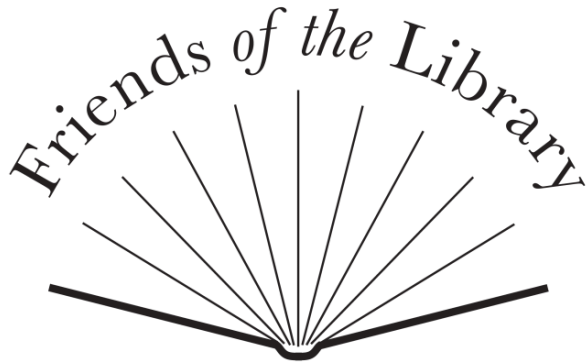
