You can download your eBooks or stream your favorite movie or music from the library. For eBooks, we have four services for you to search. Just click on **OverDrive**, **3M**, **OneClickDigital** or **Hoopla** from our website and you are in business. To stream movies or music, head straight to Hoopla. If you need assistance, call one of the libraries or check our new learning academy for a video presentation on how to use your new device. We are here to help.

Do you need a passport? We do that, too. We have been designated as a passport acceptance agency by the State Department at three locations: Christiansburg, Blacksburg and the Jessie Peterman Library in Floyd. Take a look at our passport page to see what you need to bring with you, then call 382-6969 extension 210 for an appointment and we can start you on the way to your international travel.

Did you hear that Amazon opened a bricks-and-mortar store in Seattle? It was launched on November 3 in the University Village Shopping Mall. Called Amazon Books, it holds between 5,000-6,000 items. According to Jennifer Cast, V-P for Amazon Books, all books will be displayed face-out to aid in the discoverability and that the store has been laid out to create a "discovery mecca."

Crazy8's Recreational Math Club

Blacksburg, Christiansburg and Meadowbrook libraries have been the lucky recipients of **the Crazy8's recreational math club**. This program is sponsored by a nonprofit with the "mission to help kids love numbers so they can handle math in real life".


Crazy8's offers several free options for parent and child math fun. There is a wacky nightly email with a math bedtime story, an interactive math app for tablets and phones and three sessions of after-school, interactive activities for grades K-2 and 3-5. Each of the three sessions runs for eight weeks.

The University of Chicago has been evaluating the Crazy8's program over a nine month school year and the results were published recently in Science magazine. The study found that the students who participated in the Crazy8's program "demonstrated the equivalent of a three month advantage over their peers." For students with parents who identified as "math anxious", the demonstrated math improvement was equivalent to a six month advantage.

The Blacksburg library began offering Crazy8's math this fall with great success.

Local children have participated in Glow in the Dark geometry with glow sticks (pictured), Marshmallow Catapults, Toilet Paper Olympics and Spy Training. Each program is designed to make math fun and interactive. Surprisingly, attendance at the Blacksburg branch has averaged 75% girls. Crazy8's has been a huge boost in the national effort to make math more attractive to girls.





Christiansburg and Meadowbrook will begin offering Crazy8's math in January 2016.
