
Branch Updates

MEADOWBROOK | Memorial Barn Quilt Dedication in memory of Linda Wilson was held on a beautiful – Saturday, November 17 in the Meadowbrook Courtyard.



The memorial barn quilt was unveiled in the garden of the Meadowbrook Courtyard, and Linda's love of quilt-

ing, gardening, and art are reflected in her years of dedicated service to the Meadowbrook Center. The barn quilt was created by artist Gaetan Desombre. The quilt represents her love of family, quilting, gardening, nature, and the community. Linda Wilson was instrumental in the creation of the Meadowbrook Public Library. Immediately following the dedication we had a program called *Quilting Treasures* with Kevin Womack. Textile artist, Kevin Womack, presented examples of his quilting work spanning the last 30 years, including examples of traditional quilting, art quilting, hand dying, and surface design techniques. Linda would have enjoyed the program and we are thankful for the beautiful barn quilt that will keep her memory alive.
