## Spring Book Sale


Find great reads for all ages at the Blacksburg Friends of the Library used book sale on April 21st and 22nd. Fill a regular plastic grocery bag for only \$5!

LVA On the Go is a traveling exhibit designed to bring local history, family history, and educational materials to communities across Virginia. LVA ambassadors will be on hand to help you engage with all the materials and resources that the Library of Virginia has to offer.

#### It's a Capital Idea: Improvement Coming to Blacksburg and Christiansburg

One of MFRL's Strategic Goals is to Develop Spaces. We are committed to developing, and redeveloping, our library spaces around our patrons' needs and expectations. As we approach the end of our last Strategic Plan (which runs through June 2024), we are excited that two projects that work towards this goal have been included in Montgomery County's Capital Improvement program: Blacksburg Library Outdoor Improvements; and Christiansburg Library Renovation and Expansion.

#### Blacksburg Library Outdoor Improvement

It was during the pandemic that the lack of a space for outdoor programming and use at Blacksburg became most clear. Where Christiansburg and Meadowbrook have plenty of outdoor space for programs, events, and even just reading on a sunny day, Blacksburg's lot is tight. Jessie Peterman Memorial Library in Floyd also has a lot without a great deal of extra space, but at least there are not through streets on all four sides. The best space at Blacksburg for outdoor library activity is on the Draper Road lawn, but traffic is an issue. With the cooperation of the town, we have set up snow fencing for some programs in the past few years to keep our patrons separate from cars. But we could not help but think of the possibilities if a more permanent solution could be developed.

So began the concept of the Blacksburg Library Outdoor Improvement. Through Montgomery County's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) 2023-2027, we now have over \$400,000 available to create a beautiful, traffic-safe, flexible outdoor library space on the Draper Road side of Blacksburg Library. As currently planned, the Outdoor Service Area will feature a re-graded landscape, a perimeter fence with signage and built-in storytelling features, patio seating, a wood trellis, a storytime presentation/mini-amphitheater space, a nature exploration and garden space, and needed power and lighting. It will be accessible to all and compliment both the library and the neighborhood.

The Outdoor Service Area project is being led by Colley Architects of Blacksburg and managed by the Montgomery County General Services Department. We are hoping for a timeline that gets the project done by National Library Week 2024 – but if that is missed, Summer 2024 as a fallback.

#### Christiansburg Library Renovation and Expansion

Although Christiansburg Library serves as the primary library for Christiansburg, as well as the Riner and Pilot communities, the current 35-year old facility is no longer adequate. Its systems are dated and frequently fail, and it is also simply not big enough. The renovation and expansion of Christiansburg Library will increase square footage from 15,001 to 31,954 and provide a modern, flexible platform for library service. The CIP currently has almost \$10 million set for the Christiansburg Library renovation, to be expended from July 2024 through June 2027.

Renovation of the Christiansburg Library facility will provide a durable and modern building ready for decades of public use. A renovated facility will accommodate growth in demand and population, emerging library services such as maker and robotics labs, children's STEM area, media lab, a computer classroom, and RFID materials management; it will also meet patron's current expectations for public internet access, study/telemedicine spaces, community meeting spaces, teen services, children's programming, excellent library collections, and high-quality in-person service. As we near time to begin planning and developing Requests for Proposals from the library architecture firms, there will be a range of opportunities for community input, probably as early as 2024.

In addition to these CIP funded projects, we will be asking for major renovations for Blacksburg Library in subsequent CIP cycles. And we haven't forgotten about improvements to Jessie Peterman Memorial Library in Floyd, and Meadowbrook Library in Shawsville (about which you will learn more in the Friends Newsletter for summer). Not to mention, the possibilities of expanded mobile library services and development of service models for other communities in Montgomery and Floyd County. Thanks to the Friends of the Library and our community, we are dreaming big, and we appreciate your input and support as we work to inform, inspire, empower and connect the people we serve.


