28th Annual Garden Tour

The New River Valley Garden Tour will take place Saturday, July 6th from 9am-5pm. The tour showcases innovative, specialty, and simply beautiful private gardens in the New River Valley each July. The event is sponsored by the Friends of the Library with the cooperation of the New River Valley Master Gardeners' Association.

The tour features seven glorious gardens located in Christiansburg. Tickets for this self-guided tour, which include a program and map, are \$15. Tickets are available now at the Blacksburg, Christiansburg, Floyd, and Shawsville libraries. Tickets are also available <u>online</u> or at each of the gardens on the day of the tour.



The Friends of the Library volunteers serve as ticket takers/sellers on tour day and are stationed at each garden to welcome the tour goers as they arrive. The tour would not be possible without the incredible team of volunteers that play an important role in the success of the tour. Thank you to each and every one that joins us in bringing this tour to the community.

This is our second year hosting a rain barrel raffle. There will be a raffle for winners' choice of one of three painted rain barrels at the Moore Garden. Our inaugural raffle in 2023 raised over \$700 in additional funds for the library.

A feature added in the last few years are musicians and plein air artists. Their compliment to the atmosphere of the gardens makes for a lovely addition. It is suggested you bring your friends and make a day of the tour, taking your time and enjoying lunch in between the tour sites. Wear comfortable shoes, bring an umbrella (just in case), and of course your camera. We thank each garden owner as well as the many volunteers for their efforts in making this day special!

An added bonus of being a tour volunteer is the invitation to attend our gratitude social on Sunday, July 7th hosted by The Steeves at their garden, 706 York Drive, Blacksburg.

He has removed invasive plants and created paths throughout the wooded area.

Montgomery Museum Garden ([MM] on map) 300 Pepper St., Christiansburg

Beth Umberger and Master Gardeners

The gardens surrounding the former Montgomery Museum (built originally as the Presbyterian Church Manse in about 1854) have been developed over the years by Master Gardeners in 1989. In the last 15 years hundreds of community volunteers, with guidance from Beth Umberger, developed the lower part of the garden as a native habitat. Using plants native to the eastern United States, the goal is to provide host plants for insects and their predators. Vegetables are grown in the garden to share with the community.

The garden at the Moore residence is a tribute to Connie's grandparents who built the house 101 years ago on what was a small farm on the outskirts of town. She has maintained many of the original planting beds and plants, including a 70 year-old Norway Maple, that began as an upstart seedling invading one of the flower beds and now provides ample shade for the inviting side porch. The farm buildings have been repurposed, with the old corn crib now a chicken coop and the old laundry serving as a storage and potting shed.

Thea Vincenti




