About the Imagination Library

Since spring 2024, Montgomery-Floyd Regional Library has been proud to be a partner of the local groups in our counties that bring Dolly Parton's Imagination Library to this community. Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is dedicated to inspiring a love of reading by gifting books free of charge to children from birth to age five, through funding shared by Dolly Parton and local community partners. Today, her program spans five countries and gifts over 3 million free books each month to children around the world.

In our area, the Dolly Parton Imagination Library initiative is funded and run by community organizations in Montgomery County and Floyd County: The Imagination Library of Montgomery County and Christmas for Children Floyd.

Through volunteer efforts, these groups have worked hard to ensure the availability and sustainability of the program. MFRL supports their efforts by letting all new cardholders know about the program, distributing information through handouts, our website, and social media, and by talking it up at our storytimes and children's programs. Let's take a brief look at the program and its local impact.

In 1995, music legend, humanitarian, and entrepreneur Dolly Parton launched the Imagination Library to benefit the children of her home county just down I-81 in East Tennessee. Dolly's vision was to foster a love of reading among her county's preschool children and their families. By mailing high quality, age appropriate books directly to their homes, Dolly sparked excitement about books among parents and children and shared the magic that reading together can create. The program hews to the principle that books are for all, regardless of their family's income or circumstances. The first book order in 1995 totaled just over 1,700. Today, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library sends more than three million books per month to children around the world. The Imagination Library also has Bilingual/Spanish books available for children in Spanish speaking households and braille and audio books for children who have visual impairment.


In the year that both counties have had the Imagination Library available, registration has grown. As of 2025, there are over 2,200 preschoolers enrolled in Montgomery and Floyd Counties -- over 41% of the children aged 0-4 in our area (Census 2000). While this is a great number, we all would love for the number to increase – Dolly has books to send! People can help strengthen and grow the Imagination Library in the community by

- Sharing the availability of the Imagination Library with people you know
- Reaching out to child-serving institutions in day care settings, houses of worship, schools, and other settings
- Supporting the sponsoring groups through volunteering and donations

The Imagination Library reports that recent and ongoing studies suggest that participation in the Imagination Library is positively and significantly associated with higher measures of early language and math development. The entire program, and the selection of each book included, reflect how early childhood literacy experts and Imagination Library leadership take great care in choosing books that meet the different needs of children as they progress from birth to age five. And of course while growing readers, the Imagination Library also grows children who will become library users for a lifetime.


